

Profile of the college

S.N.M Training college is owned by Hindu Matha Dharma Paripalana Sabha, a voluntary organisation formed in 1882 by the spirited youth of backward Ezhava Community in the Vadakkekara region under the guidance of Ashtavadhani Parisudha Vishista Paranatha Khanadana Venkatagiri Sasthrikal, an Andhrite theologist who pioneered Hindu Matha Parishath Movement, with an aim of promoting vigorous campaign for social justice and liberation from social bondage.

The college was established in 1960 as an ardous task of imparting teacher education to the weaker sections of the society. The college is situated at Moothakunnam on the banks of the mighty Periyar river in the vicinity of the famous Sankaranarayana Temple. As the college is by the side of NH 17 and is just 4 km away from Kodungallur the very famous ancient port town of Musiris, it is easily accessible by road. The nearest railway station is at Aluva 15 km away. The calm and serene atmosphere is quite and conducive for intellectual pursuit.

In December 2005 our college started post graduate course in Education, (M.Ed.) with an intake of 25 students. From 2011 onwards the intake has been increased to 35 students. The college has set up a tradition of its own with regard to the decorum and decency of its student teachers.

We try to spread the reverberation of the words 'Vidyakondu prabhudharakuvin' that served as a panacea to instill pride & self confidence in the minds of the downtrodden and outcasted sections of people of our state in the 19th century, to the young minds of 21st century.

The ushering in of an integrated and mature personality who always upholds the values of universal brotherhood and sustainable progress of humanity is the ultimate mission of our institution.







Defaulters will have to pay a fine of Rs.1 per day.

Loan of Books


The borrowing facility is restricted to members only. They must borrow books personally.

- Students and staff shall co-operate with college authorities to ensure peaceful atmosphere congenial to the academic activities and overall developments of student and for the maintenance of discipline in the campus
- 10. Megaphones, Loudspeakers, Mobilephones etc. shall not be used. Posters, banners or boards should not be put up on the campus without permission of the principal.
- 11. Every student should carry his identity card and produce it on demand by the authorities or persons authorised to do that.
- 12. In case students have any grievance or complaints they shall approach the tutor first. If they are not satisfied they may put it in writing in the grievance Redressal Box and then if needed appeal to the principal.
- 13. For neglect of work or for misconduct of a serious nature student is liable for punishment
- 14. The Principal shall be the final authority in the interpretation of college rules. Matters not covered by the rules are left to the discretion of the principal. His decision shall be final.


Ethics Committee

As per the directions of Mahatma Gandhi university, the college should function under the guidelines of the Ethics commitee consituted by each college

- 1. Students are expected to be in their uniform on the prescribed days
- 2. Students should get recommendation for leave from the optional teacher and permission from the principal before taking leave and the leave form should be submitted to the Discipline committee
- 3. Use of mobile phone is banned in the college campus
- 4. Late coming and early leaving is not permited. In case of being late, due to unforeseen reason, the student shall avail permission from discpline committee chairman

5. Students are expected to be in their respective classes at the ring of first bell itself

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General rules of discipline

- 1. The day begins with a prayer at the college. During prayer, all the members of staff and students shall stand up and observe silence till the prayer is over. There shall be no movement of any kind in the college campus at this time
- 2. During free periods the students are not expected to indulge in any outdoor games or loiter about the verandahs However they can make use of the facilites in physical education department. They should make use of library during free time. Those who prefer to sit in the class room to do academic work should not cause disturbance in any way to the neighbouring classes.
- 3. Students are expected to wear clean and respectable dress, to be punctual and regular in attendance and to be sincere in studies.
- 4. Every student should handle with care the property of the college and shall do everything in his power to preserve the cleanliness of building and furniture.
- 5. Unauthorised entry of outsiders into the campus is strictly prohibited, unless permitted by the college authorities. Students shall not bring or entertain outsiders within the campus.
- 6. Nobody shall collect money from others, attend or organise any meeting or agitation or to circulate any notice or petition among the students or exhibit them any where in the premises except by specific permission of the principal
- 7. All expressions of activities which are immoral, antisocial communal and antinational are strictly prohibited in the college campus
- 8. Students should always be respectful to their teachers, seniors and superiors, polite and courteous to all and should

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Candidate having 50 percentage of marks for the B.Ed Degree is eligible to apply for seeking admission to M.Ed. Degree Course. SC/ST and OBC candidates get usual relaxations as per rules of the Government and University.

Dissertation

The Dissertation should be on some educational theme ordinarily related to the fields of education approved by the university and supervised by a member of the faculty of the school . This report should be approximately between 10,000 and 20,000 words depending upon the nature of the topic. Four copies of dissertation bound as per instructions will have to be submitted together with 3 copies of the summary during the second semester.

ADMISSION FOR B.Ed PROGRAMME

- Eligibility for admission, norms for admission, reservation of seats for B.Ed. Degree Programme shall be according to the rules framed by the university and NCTE from time to time.
- 2. The strength of the college is fixed at 50 students per year and total 100 for two batches.
- 3. The principal may send away any student who is not likely to prove a good teacher
- No student shall be admitted unless he / she pays the fee as per rules & produce all the certificates of qualification mentioned below

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1. Transfer certificate from the college last attended

- 2. S.S.L.C.
- 3. Degree / Diploma certificate & Mark list
- 4. Course & conduct certificate
- 5. Migration certificate (in case of graduates from other universities)
- 6. Community certificate in respect of backward class students

Fees

- 1. Every student shall on admission pay the full amount of fees including special fees and caution deposit.
- 2. Receipts signed by the accountant will be issued on the realisation of all kinds of fees, fines and other dues
- 3. Students belonging to S.C./S.T., OBC are exempted from paying the caution deposit
- 4. Fee Concession : Students belonging to S.C./S.T./OBC can avail fee concession if they produce caste & income certificate at the beginning of the course and apply in the prescribed form. Students belonging to O.B.C. are eligible for fee concession only if their annual income comes in the prescribed limit as per the government norms

Refund of Caution Deposit Rules

- 1. It shall be responsibility of the student to claim the refund of caution deposit paid by him / her for the particular course immediately after the closing date of the college after the expiry of the academic year in which the course is completed.
- 2. If the student takes T.C. before the completion of the course, the caution deposit will be refunded before the closing date of the college
- 3. All claims for refund of caution deposit shall be prefered before the re-opening date of the next academic year in which the course is completed. In the case of those who discontinued or left the institution during the tenure of a course, their claim shall be preferred before the reopening date of the next academic year, following the academic year in which they would have completed the course had they continued in institution. The caution deposit amount will be refunded only if the connected receipt issued from the college is produced along with the application for refund of the caution deposit. Failure to produce the original receipt will result in the forfeiture of the same

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
